Crow Jr/Sr High School

135 students enjoy the ongoing success story that has become almost legend at Crow Jr./Sr. High School.

Students in grades 7-12 enjoy a 1:18 teacher-student ratio that allows each teacher the time to reach out and personally connect with each of our young adults on this closed campus.

The curriculum is rich for a small school: Two years of French, Band, Choir, 21st Century Technology coursework, Woods, Intro to Engineering, Drama, Yearbook, College Now Pre-Calculus, Health Occupations and Construction. There is a focus period so students can develop an education plan and build an education profile to guide learning toward student's personal, career and post-high school goals.

Activities & Athletics

We believe the well-rounded student is productive and busy in many arenas: football, choir, volleyball, pep band, cross-country, drama, basketball, student government, wrestling, school clubs, track, cheerleading, softball, and baseball.



The Success Story

The district is proud of its small, personalized classes. At the high school we are delighted with our College-Now classes; Yearbook; French; K-12 music program; professional/technical program (photography and woodworking).

Applegate has established an academic data team that uses an assessment system (easyCBM) to frequently monitor students' progress towards state standards. Because of this monitoring system approach, Applegate has implemented a Walk-To-Read and a Walk-To-Math initiative.

The Positive Behavior Support program is fully implemented in both schools. High school student's academic and career decisions are supported by an A.S.P.I.R.E. program. Small classes and a caring, personal environment result in an extremely small dropout rate.
