On Tuesday, February 12th, the Crow High and Middle School Bands played their Winter Concert. The concert had to be postponed due to the director's illness, and later the athletic schedule, hence the later date.

The concert, held in the CH/MS Cafeteria, was extremely well attended – standing room only! Both bands played *extraordinarily* well!!

The Middle School Band played selection ranging from classical to rock to jazz. 7th grader Adrien Ching was featured on shredding rock guitar on a fun piece called "We're On a Mission to Rock," while 8th grader Jacob Dougherty brought out some jazzy trombone on "Slidin' the Blues." High School Band played not only music from the DC trip, but two new pieces, including arrangement of both Cohen's "Halleluiah" as well as (late for the holiday season), "You're a Mean One, Mr. Grinch," which featured junior Makayla Brown on bass clarinet.

There was also a brief photo presentation on the High School Band's trip to DC for the Parade of Heroes that took place over Veteran's Day in November. Honorary medals were distributed to the band members that were on the trip.
