A big congratulations is in order for **Mackenzie Larsen** and **Madison Johnson**. Both students have been selected for the Rotary Youth Leadership Award (RYLA). After an eight year hiatus, Applegate Elementary has revived an annual Jump Rope for Heart event, in which the students raise awareness of heart health by learning about heart healthy behaviors through classroom curriculum. The three week event culminates in a marathon jump rope activity and monetary donations raised for The American Heart Association. This year the students were able to raise over \$500 dollars for the foundation in which they give directly to OHSU for research for treatment for infant respiratory distress syndrome, cholesterol inhibitors, microsurgery, drug-coated stents, artificial heart valves, and techniques and standards for CPR.
